1. Cross Country Relay

That a NZSSAA Cross Country Relay Championships be held on the Sunday morning following the NZSSAA Cross Country championships. These Relay Championships be contested in two races, female and male by teams of 5 in three grades, Year 9, Junior and Senior (ages as for NZSSAA Cross Country) and selected by regional selectors with each runner covering a 2km lap. The regions invited to select teams are: Southland, Otago, South Canterbury, Canterbury/West Coast, Tasman, Wellington, Wairarapa, Manawatu, Whanganui, Taranaki, East Coast NI, Waikato Bay of Plenty, Counties Manukau, Auckland, North Harbour, Northland.

- Alec Mc Nab thought it would increase competition numbers to the cross country event potentially

- John Tylden said entry would be at \$30 per team and only one team per region
- Martin Holmes thought it was definitely worth a trial
- Any potential regional co-ordinators/selectors to see Michelle at the end of the meeting
- Paul Meads suggested information goes on website to recruit managers

2. 2 ½ Day Programme for Athletics Champs

- Alec Mc Nab spoke in support of the trial
- Martin Holmes happy to trlal it
- David Knox wold like to trial it
- John Gamblin thought it may benefit Road Race Champs
- Warwick spoke of previous trial that he thought was successful. It didn't remain due to late NZQA exams
- Tony Rogers in favour, due to congestion of programme and allowing for new events. Health and Safety for events is a big issue.
- Rhys Taucher thought there were very few negatives and allowed for growth and development of athletes by allowing them to do more events
- Murray Green thought that kids would get to do more events for basically the same cost of travelling
- Could offer a bigger package to sponsors etc
- Executive will work on a programme for consideration.

3. Pole Vault and 300m H

That the Open Pole Vault and Open 300m Hurdles become Junior and Senior events from 2016.

Comments:

- Noted that juniors don't bother competing against older athletes. Would build base for stronger senior fields. Would encourage participation.
- Both events are Athletics NZ events of the future and we should try and support as much as we can.
- Murray Green asked why 2000m Steeples was not included?
- Martin Holmes and other coaches supportive of age group split
- Alaistair said coaches would take juniors to these events now. Asked about 200m Hurdles for juniors
- Discussion around the pros and cons of 200mH vs 300m H
- John Tylden asked for the motion to be split. Deal with Pole Vault 1st and Hurdles 2nd

John Tylden moved that Pole Vault becomes a Junior and Senior event from 2016

Tony Rogers moved that the Open 300m Hurdles become Junior and Senior event in 2016 with distances to be confirmed.

Alec commented that time is needed to come up with event as different ways to run 200mH, markings on track required etc

Philippa suggested that we speak to athletes about their preferred distance and not just the coaches.

Alec Mc Nab proposed that after making a change to the 300mH event we will investigate and research options of juniors running 200mH or 300mH

Murray moved that 2000m Steeplechase be made into a junior and senior event (for girls and boys) further consideration for distance and height of steeples for juniors to be investigated
